GENERAL INFORMATION

Nxai Pan is located on the western edge of the fossil pan from which the camp takes its name. The camp faces east over the open grasslands of the pans. The biggest draw to Nxai Pan National Park are the zebras that migrate by the thousands to the area – the second largest land animal migration in Southern Africa.

Day trips to Baines' Baobabs are highly popular, and include a picnic lunch at the site. These age-old trees were immortalised in paintings by the artist and adventurer Thomas Baines in 1862. If you were to compare Baines' paintings to the scene today, you would find that after 150 years, the trees are nearly identical – testament to the age of these magnificent giants





Nxai Pan airstrip is roughly 15-min drive from camp. Light aircraft flight approx 40-min from Maun or 1-hour from Kasane. 4WD self-drive from Maun takes 3 hours and transfers available from the park gate

This is a family-friendly camp with a family unit consisting of connected tents for parents and children.

The minimum age is 6, except for certain periods of the year. Families travelling with children aged 6-11yrs must book private activities.

There is also a special bush activity program for children and early mealtimes on request.

ACCOMODATION

The camp's nine tents face the waterhole, with the main area being the central best place for game viewing from the water hole. Frequent visitors to the water hole include elephants, cheetah, as well as the migratory herds of zebra (usually) from late December to early April, however this is entirely dependent on the summer rainfall in Botswana which affects the migratory cycle

There are 8 Suites and 1 Family Suite. All these have an elevated, private viewing deck with outside seating, a Ceiling fan, tea and coffee facility, charging station (USB), writing desk, open hanging space and shelving for clothes. There is also a digital safe, spare blankets, insect repellents and an emergency horn.





Each tent is equipped with an en-suite, flushing toilet, double vanity basins, outdoor shower, hot and cold water supply. A certain tented suite also features a romantic outdoor honeymoon bathtub. All rooms can be configured as a double (king bed) or a twin (two 3/4 beds) with plug charging points suitable for sleep apnea machines but not hair dryers. Lighting is always available.



MEALS

Mornings start off with a light breakfast around the fire before the morning activity, which includes a tea and coffee bush break.

Once back at camp, brunch is served and after some relaxation, high tea is commenced.

The afternoon activity that follows includes snacks and sundowners, before guests return for dinner.





All menus and mealtimes accommodate sightings.

Communal dining is standard, with indoor and outdoor dining options.

A water fountain, soft drinks, local beers, and spirits, plus a selection of South African wines are included.

ACTIVITIES

All activities are hosted by expert guides and tracker teams. Departure times and duration is tailored to season, sightings and guest interests. . Activities restricted to national park opening hours with no off-road driving permitted.

Safari game drives (6max) are available during the dry months.

Partake in Bushman-led nature walks. These easygoing, immersive walks are conducted near camp to learn about ancient San survival techniques, medical plants and more.





Baines' Baobabs day trip takes guests to picnic at Kudiakam salt pan and its island of ancient baobab trees.



Experience the zebra migration between December and March, during which summer rains bring thousands of zebra to the lush grasslands

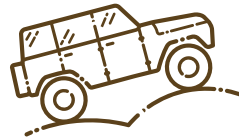

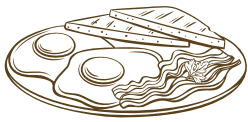

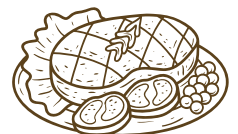

GENERAL INFORMATION

Moremi Crossing is a 16 tent, eco friendly camp built on a palm fringed island surrounded by the Moremi's game-rich seasonal floodplains and overlooking Chief's Island. Moremi Crossing is a new style safari camp combining luxury with simplicity. This is a 100% eco-friendly development featuring the latest in solar and waste disposal technology.

The camp is located on Ntswi Island, opposite the southernmost part of Chief's Island in the Gunn's Private Concession (NG27B), below the Moremi Game Reserve.

The Ntswi airstrip is roughly 10-min drive from camp. Light aircraft flight approximately 20-min from Maun and 1h30 from Kasane.





One of the larger Okavango Delta camps, laidback Moremi Crossing, has a sociable crescent-shaped main area perched on stilts and huge decks for fantastic views of passing elephants and red lechwe.

This is a family-friendly camp with connected tents for parents and children.

The minimum age is 6. Families travelling with children aged 6-11yrs must book private activities. Walking safaris and mokoro is available for children above the age of 12yrs.

There is also a special bush activity program for children and early mealtimes on request.

ACCOMODATION

Sitting along Ntswi Island's riverine forest of magnificent palms and ancient trees, each tent has floodplain views.

There are 14 Tented Suites, 1 Family Suite, 1 Honeymoon Tent and 1 Guide Tent. All these have an elevated, private viewing deck with outside seating, a ceiling fan, tea and coffee facility, charging station (USB), writing desk, open hanging space and shelving for clothes. There is also a digital safe, spare blankets, insect repellents and an emergency horn.





Each tent is equipped with an en-suite, flushing toilet, double vanity basins, outdoor shower, hot and cold water supply. A certain tented suite also features a romantic outdoor honeymoon bathtub. All rooms can be configured as a double (king bed) or a twin (two 3/4 beds) with plug charging points suitable for sleep apnea machines but not hair dryers. Lighting is always available.



MEALS

Mornings start off with a light breakfast around the fire before the morning activity, which includes a tea and coffee bush break.

Once back at camp, brunch is served and after some relaxation, high tea is commenced.

The afternoon activity that follows includes snacks and sundowners, before guests return for a five-course dinner.





All menus and mealtimes accommodate sightings.

Communal dining is standard, with indoor and outdoor dining options.

A water fountain, soft drinks, local beers, and spirits, plus a premium selection of South African red, white and sparkling wines are included.

ACTIVITIES

All activities are hosted by expert guides and tracker teams. Departure times and duration is tailored to season, sightings and guest interests.

Day and night drives (9max) with off-road tracking are available during the dry months.

Partake on nature walks to explore the African bush up close with specialist walking guides.

Boat trips are offered during the flood season. Fishing is also available.





Wind through hippo-made water channels on a guided Mokoro trip.

Adventure camping on an island can be pre-booked as a supplemental activity for one or two nights. Maximum 6 guests can be accommodated in 3 private canvas bow tents with stretcher beds.

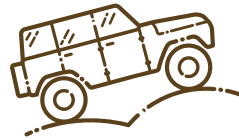

GENERAL INFORMATION

Bakwena is an eco-luxury retreat on the banks of the Chobe River, located in the friendly town of Kasane right next to Chobe National Park, ideally positioned for the place where Zambia, Zimbabwe, Namibia, and Botswana meet. This is where you want to go to for a truly heart-warming Botswana safari.

The lodge is an oasis with excellent food (you will never forget their home-made bread), comfortable rooms, cozy nooks, and stunning views. But there is more: owners Jenny and Adam Young are deeply committed to responsible tourism and sharing their 'sanctuary' – as they like to call it – in the purest possible way.





Bakwena Lodge is the only lodge on the Chobe River that was constructed according to eco-principles, with locally sourced materials and without any harmful chemicals.

When in your room, pay extra attention to the carefully hand-selected furniture, all sourced from local craftsmen and vintage stores. Even the curtains are fair trade; they come from Madagascar to create employment there and are made from local cotton.

Come here to immerse yourself in local culture and enjoy a natural safari in a responsible lodge, oozing with African authenticity.

ACCOMODATION

Bakwena Lodge comprises ten rondavel style chalets, two of which are family units. All situated under the shady canopy of Acacia trees, each site has been selected for its river view and is surrounded by indigenous riverine bush. As mentioned before, the chalets are built according to both ecological and traditional African principles.

The chalets boast a laid-back kind of luxury, which immediately unwinds your body and mind, especially after taking an outdoor shower under the African night sky: an absolute must-do. Each chalet has an interior bathroom opening on to an outside garden with an outside shower. Built-in daybeds offer ample opportunity to absorb the changing moods of the Chobe, take in an amazing sunset – with the biggest orange glowing ball you have ever seen – or peek at wildlife seeking refreshment in the river.





Once settled in, the staff will be more than happy to guide you to the main area where you will find a lounge, restaurant – serving African fusion dishes inspired by traditional Setswana cuisine –, a Rain Tree Bar overlooking the river, and an inviting swimming pool where you can take a plunge.



MEALS

The morning starts off with an early rise and grabbing a bite of continental breakfast before guests head out for the first activity. Once back at camp, you are greeted with a hearty, lunch before the siesta period of relaxation.

Before departing on the evening activity, there will be some afternoon tea and light bites. Following lunch, the guests will departure on their late afternoon activity in the cooler afternoon. The day is ended with some wining and dinner at the dining hall where guests can mingle.



ACTIVITIES:

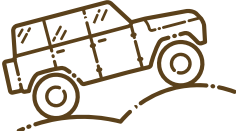
Game drives through the Chobe National Park in the early morning offer the best opportunities to spot some of the sheer big cats.

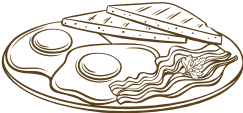

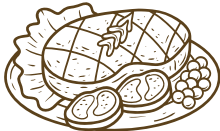
